- Participants will embark on a personal adventure by joining this highly interactive, skills and knowledge-building programme that is designed to stimulate them intellectually and empower them personally.

Programme dates and fees:

Who is the course for?	• Closed enrolment programme for National Taipei University of Education students. • Participants must have an English language level of B1 or B2 in the Common European Framework for languages (CEFR) or equivalent. The English course at King's will be at B1/2 level. • Participants must be over the age of 18.
Learning Objectives	• Understand key aspects of social, economic and political life in London and the UK. • Increase level of confidence in all four English language competency areas. • Develop team working and presentation skills in English. • Build personal confidence and sense of global citizenship.
Learning Methods	• Students will learn through a mixture of lectures, seminars and group work activities. • Learning will be very active and participants will develop their knowledge beyond the classroom through guest talks and experiential learning activities to leading London institutions, museums and galleries as well as dynamic and evocative zones like Westminster and Brixton.
Assessment	• Participants will work together in small groups to produce a presentation based on their learning during the course. • The course is not assessed with a grade; however, participants will receive verbal feedback from their tutors in the last session. • Students will receive a certificate of participation upon successful completion of the course.
Faculty & Staffing	This programme will be taught by King's faculty, delivering research-enriched academic content from a range of research and teaching departments. NTUE staff will accompany the group.
Summer at King's	Students will have the opportunity to learn and socialize with 1,700+ students who come to King's each summer from 60+ countries around the world. A truly global experience.

Development overview

Accommodation:

Students on this programme will be able to book their accommodation in King's halls of residences. Booking for summer student accommodation will open later in the year. As applications will be received before April, Summer Programmes will advise King's Accommodation Services to earmark beds for students on this programme. This accommodation fee is separate from the tuition fee outlined in this proposal . Accommodation price is £410 per week, so for a two-week course is £820.
